

UL Lafayette Admissions Checklist

Visit campus.

Come and experience what UL Lafayette has to offer. It's never too early to visit! Your tour can include a meeting with a professor in your academic area, a tour of campus and residence halls, and an information session with an admissions counselor. Apply for Admission.

Apply online at www.louisiana.edu/apply. Application fees, immunization forms, and selective service registrations can be mailed, faxed, or hand delivered to the Enrollment Services office. In order to be admitted, students must successfully complete the Louisiana Board of Regents core curriculum, as well as meet our additional requirements located on the back of this sheet. Take the ACT or SAT.

Be sure to enter codes for UL Lafayette (ACT code: 1612 / SAT code: 6672) to have your scores sent directly to us. Take the test both as a junior and during the fall of your senior year. To meet UL Lafayette ACT/SAT admission standards, students must have a 19 Math ACT (460 Math SAT) or an 18 English ACT (450 Verbal SAT).

Attend UL Lafayette Preview Day.

This is a great opportunity for students and parents to learn more about the university by meeting with current students and faculty, touring campus and residence halls, and more. Interest sessions will be conducted covering admission standards and application processes, financial aid and scholarships, on-campus living, and the Honors Program. Apply for Housing.

Students are encouraged to apply as soon as possible. Preference will be granted on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications must be submitted with appropriate fees by June 15 for the fall semester. Housing information can be found at <http://housing.louisiana.edu>.

Apply for Scholarships.

First time freshmen must have an ACT Composite of 23 (SAT 1050), ACT English of 18 (450 SAT Verbal), ACT Math of 19 (460 SAT Math), and a high school GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 non-weighted scale; and have applied for admission to the university to be considered for scholarships. Scholarship applications can be obtained online at <http://admissions.louisiana.edu/scholarships>. The priority scholarship deadline is November 15th. Students with an ACT Composite of 28 (SAT 1260) are eligible for priority scholarship consideration. All students meeting eligibility requirements must submit a completed scholarship application and apply for admission to the university by January 31st.

Apply for Financial Aid and TOPS.

Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by applying online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. For priority consideration, complete and submit by May 1. Reapply online every year by July 1 to continue receiving financial assistance. All students must submit a FAFSA to be considered for TOPS, grants, loans, and federal work study.

Register for Orientation.

Freshman Orientation invitations are mailed to admitted students in the spring. At Orientation, you will schedule your classes; receive your Cajun Card student ID, and more. Once you receive your invitation, register as early as you can! Dates can be found at <http://orientation.louisiana.edu>.

Admission Requirements

Successful completion of the Louisiana Board of Regents high school core curriculum

AND

Qualification for either freshman English or college Algebra. Students with a 19 Math ACT (460 Math SAT) are eligible for college Algebra; students with an 18 English ACT (450 Verbal SAT) are eligible for freshman English.

AND EITHER

A high school GPA of 2.5 or higher

OR

An ACT composite of at least 23 (SAT 1060) and at least a 2.0 GPA

OR

Rank in the top 25% of the high school graduation class and at least a 2.0 GPA.

Home-school Requirements

Home-school students must meet in-state freshman requirements

OR

Have an ACT composite of 26, and an 18 English or 19 Math ACT score

OR

Have an ACT composite of 23, and an 18 English or 19 Math ACT score, and a 2.5 GPA.

High School Core Curriculum*

- 4 units: English I, II, III, IV
- 1 unit: Algebra I (1 unit) or Applied Algebra IA and IB (2 units)
- 1 unit: Algebra II
- 1 unit: Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus or comparable adv. math
- 1 unit: Biology
- 1 unit: Chemistry
- 1 unit: Earth Science, Environmental Science, Physical Science, Biology II, Chemistry II, Physics, Physics II or Physics for Technology (1 unit)
- 1 unit: American History
- 1 unit: World History, Western Civilization or World Geography
- 1 unit: Civics and Free Enterprise (1 unit combined) or Civics (1 unit, non-public)

- 1 unit: Fine Arts Survey (or substitute 2 units of performance courses in music, dance and /or theater; or 2 units of visual art; or 2 units of studio art; or 1 unit of an elective from among the other subjects listed in this core curriculum)
- 2 units: Foreign Language (2 units in the same language)
- 1/2 unit: Computer Science, Computer Literacy or Business Computer Applications (or substitute at least 1/2 unit of an elective course related to computers approved by the state or 1/2 unit as an elective from among the other subjects listed in this core curriculum)
- 1 additional unit of either Advanced Math or Science
